


Welcome to the Festive edition of the Regional Partnership Board newsletter.

1 A Conference at the Temple of Peace

2 Two Independent Unpaid Carer Representatives

We successfully recruited two independent Unpaid Carers Representatives to work with the RPB to provide lived experience and help inform our work and planning for the year ahead.



3 Three Workshops Running

This year we held three successful workshops thinking about Compassionate Leadership and the way in which RPB members want to shape their future working together.



4 Four Priorities Identified

We have identified four priorities for in depth focus in the coming year: First 1,000 days, Integrated Community Care Services (ICCS), Digital working and Healthy Lives.



5 FIVE YEAR PLANS!

Our Joint Area Plan 2023-28 continues to support system change across a range of shared commitments: Starting Well, Living Well, Ageing Well and Partnership Enablers. For example, we have...



6 Six Projects Driving

We have six projects driving the development of an Integrated Community Care System (Access, Accelerated Clusters, Crisis Response, Community Reablement, Bed based Reablement, Hospital to Home)



7 Seven Stakeholders Speaking

our RPB plans are informed by an engagement framework that aims to ensure that our work is co-produced with People with Lived Experience, Carers, Citizens, Service Providers, Third Sector, Health Board and Local Authority representatives. We estimate that this year we've held at least 40 engagement exercises, incorporating 900 conversations. 8 Eight Grants a'Funding

In addition to our Regional Integration Fund, the RPB also manages a range of additional funding streams including Carers Short Breaks, Dementia Friendly Communities, Memory Assessment, Integrated Autism, Integration and Rebalancing Capital Fund, Housing with Care Fund and a Third Sector Capital Fund.





9 Nine Chapters Writing

A new workstream this year is the development of a revised approach to our Population Needs Assessment. This year we've been focusing on the needs of people with lived experience of Learning Disabilities and Babies, Children and Young People. In the future this will be expanded to • Older People • Neurodivergence • Mental Health & Dementia • Sensory Impairment • Carers • VAWDASV • Homelessness & Secure Estate - **Interactive, accessible, and co-produced**.



10 Ten Dashboards Measuring

we've strengthened our data and performance measures to demonstrate progress across all areas of our Joint Area Plan.



11 Eleven Workshops Running

(At least!) 11 workshops running topics this year included Neurodivergence, ICCS, Learning Disabilities, Mental Health, Goleudy, Capital, Dementia, Carers, Commissioning, Workforce and Digital. We estimate that we've held 140 workshops attended by 900 people.



12 Twelve RPB Meetings

12 months of RPB meetings: RPBs, SLGs, Delivery Groups, Engagement sessions, workshops and events. We estimate that we've held 1,200 meetings attended by 3000 people.
